

## **Hadel Wins Skills Contest**

MARQUETTE - Josh Hadel of Gladstone was one of the winners in a special skills challenge Wednesday at the U.P. All-Star Football practice.

Hadel was proclaimed strongest man, benching 225 pounds on 21 repetitions. The two-time All-U.P. Dream Team lineman (tackle in 2007, guard in 2008) will play at Western Michigan University, where he has been participating in offseason workouts since high school graduation.

Two players from Menominee and Kingsford also won events. Zack Anderla of Menominee caught all 32 passes thrown to him to win the receiver challenge among linemen and Jordan Maccoux, also of Menominee, had the longest throw, 57 yards.

Ryan Kleisner of Kingsford had the longest punt of 55 yards, and Cole Welch, Kingsford, was the fastest lineman at 4.764 seconds.

Derek Horde of Sault Ste. Marie caught 52 of 56 passes thrown to him in the receiver challenge.

Dan Perrault of L'Anse had 16 repetitions to win strongest man among non-linemen.

CJ Paquin of Cedarville was timed in 4.488 seconds in the 40-yard dash, making him the fastest player from either team, and Dan Menze of Marquette had the longest kick of 51 yds.
