U.P. All-Star Grid Squads To Be Announced This Week

Negaunee-Announcement of the members of the Upper Peninsula all-star squads for the North-South football game here Aug. 13 will be made within the next few days.

Sports writers and radio sports announcers of the Upper Peninsula have forwarded their ballots to the recreation committee, sponsors of the game, and votes are now being compiled.

There were 81 applicants this year, a new high. Of the number 42 are from the North and 39 from the South. The 24 players with the highest number of votes will be selected for each squad.

The recreation committee awarded several bids in its meeting this week.

St. Paul's altar society was awarded the bid for feeding the boys again this year.

The Pellow Printing Co. was awarded the contract for printing the program and tickets. Edward Stevens, recreation director, said reserve seat tickets would go on sale next Wednesday. Prices will be the same as last year.

George Sivula was awarded the insurance contract for the team members. The insurance bid will be rotated among insurance agencies.
