### **Zaleski Will Assist South**

Negaunee-The South coaching staff for the Upper Peninsula all-star football game, to be played here Saturday Aug. 12, was completed with the naming of Stanley Zaleski, of Baltimore, Md., as the South assistant coach.

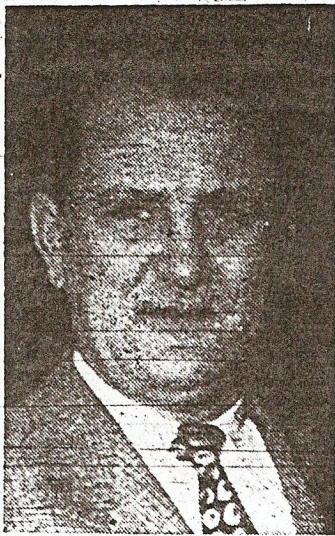
Zaleski will serve as line coach for Victor Wojciovski, who was named several weeks ago by the all-star game committee as the South coach. Wojciovski is football coach and athletic director at Mt. St. Joseph High School, Baltimore, Md., and formerly coached at Kingsford High School.

From 1929 to 1932, Zaleski attended Duryea High School in the hard coal region of Pennsylvania. He was an outstanding athlete in three sports—football, basketball and baseball. He attended the University of Scranton in Scranton, Pa., from 1933 to 1937 where he played regular center on the varsity team for three years.

In 1940 he turned to coaching and served until 1945 as football coach in the Duryea high school. He produced championship clubs in 1943 and 1944. In 1946 Zaleski became assistant coach at Mt. St. Joseph high school in Maryland city.

Eddie (Speed) Olds, of Ishpeming, and coach at Milligan College, Tenn., has been selected to handle the coaching chores for the North. His assistant is expected to be named next week.

The South squad has been named and the North squad will be announced tomorrow, according to Edward Stevens, game director. The squads will report Saturday, Aug. 5, for the week's drilling.
