All-Star Grid Players Named Tomorrow

Negaunee-Announcement of North and South squad members for the U.P. All-Star Football Game will be made tomorrow, Ed Stevens, game director, told the all-star game committee last night.

Stevens said 26 players have been selected for each team by Upper Peninsula sportswriters and sportscasters.

The contest, sixth annual event of its kind, will be staged Saturday night, August 11, in Negaunee.

Committee members spent the evening going over details concerning pre-game and half-time entertainment, housing players and printing programs. It was decided that a banquet will be held for players on August 3, the day they report in Negaunee to begin training for the gridiron classic. A dance will be held for players on August 4.

The record sale of seats for the game was continuing, Stevens told the committee. He pointed out that all seats in the permanent section of the stadium were located within the 22-yard points and that all bleacher seats were between the 10-yard lines.

Tickets are available at the following stations: Negaunee, Miller's News and the city recreation director's office; Ishpeming, Northland Bus Lines; Marquette, Getz' Department Store and the Elks Club; Munising, Putvin's and Leach's; Baraga and L'Anse, Baraga County Motor Sales.

A committee chairman said enrollments already were being received for the baton twirling clinic which is being conducted in connection with the all-star contest. The clinic, to be held from August 6 to 11, will be conducted by Bruce Stengel, Marquette University drum major and nationally famous baton twirler. Classes for beginning and advanced students will be held daily from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Those desiring to enroll should contact Stevens in the city recreation department.
