### **Replacements Necessary In Grid Lineups**

Negaunee-Six of the boys selected to play in the All-Star football game in Negaunee on August 17 have notified the coaches committee they will be unable to participate, Oscar Wassberg, in charge of the event, reported today.

To replace them, the coaches have chosen Bernie Rivers, Negaunee, guard, David Romberg, Hancock, end; Frank Stropich, Escanaba (St. Joe), end; and Milton Bahrke, Stambaugh, back, and two more will be named later.

The six who will not play are: John Kujula, Newberry, could not pass the physical; Chester Payzeck, Iron River and William Holmes, Stambaugh, are attending Northwestern University this summer; Don Scott, Escanaba, underwent an operation recently; Richard Broadland, Ontonagon, enlisted in the Army, and Jack Brown, Hancock, who gave no reason.

Wassberg also announced that station WJMS, Upper Michigan-Wisconsin Broadcasting Company, Ironwood, will broadcast the game to Upper Peninsula residents.

“A program of activities to be presented between the halves of the game is being worked on and will be announced when plans are complete,” Wassberg said.

In the list of players for the South squad, published a few days ago, the name of Frank Horvath, Stephenson, a tackle, was omitted. Wallie Schliawski, backfield man, is from Menominee, not Stephenson.
