### **Organizations Must Apply For Shares**

Proceeds from the second annual Upper Peninsula all-star football game to be played under the lights on the Playgrounds in Negaunee Saturday night, August 16, will be distributed to U.P. charities, Leslie Richards, chairman of the Negaunee Recreation Committee, said today.

The committee will pro-rate profits of the game on the basis of the number of persons aided by each charity and effectiveness of the aid rendered.

Legitimate charitable groups, whose services cover the entire Peninsula, may contact Dr. S.J. Bessolo, Negaunee, secretary of the committee, and make application for a share of the receipts. From information submitted by those groups, the committee will make its decision as to how large a share of the profits each group will receive.

### **Must Make Application**

“We would like to emphasize that charitable organizations must apply to the Negaunee recreation committee for a share of the profits,” Dr. Bessolo said. “The committee and the game director, Oral J. LaCombe, have too great a task to take on more work, such as contacting charity organizations and groups.

“Peninsula-wide, in our sense of the phrase, means the organization or group must take care of the persons from various parts of the Peninsula. The Holy Family orphanage in Marquette, for example, will be eligible for a share of the receipts, since it takes care of children from all parts of the Peninsula. It must apply for a share, however.”

The move to distribute profits of the game to charity organizations was made after committee members discussed the peninsula-wide aspects of the game. While the contest is being promoted by the Negaunee recreation committee and backed by Negaunee funds, the committee felt it would become increasingly important in the Peninsula and decided to institute the policy of apportioning the money this year.

“Players and fans from every section of the U.P. will come to Negaunee for the game,” Richards said, “and the committee believes the proceeds also should be Peninsula-wide.”

## **Where To Write**

Charity organizations should address their requests to Dr. S.J. Bessolo, Secretary, Negaunee Recreation Committee, Negaunee, Michigan.

While no deadline was set for the acceptance of applications, the committee expressed hope all U.P. organizations would apply as early as next week, in order that last-minute confusion may be avoided.

Players from high schools in the Peninsula who were graduated this summer will form the “North” and “South” squads. There will be 25 chosen from north schools and 25 from the south. They will be coached by Faust Ferzacca, Green Bay, and Arthur Krueger, Milwaukee.
