U.P. All-Star Grid Squads Will Begin Drills Saturday

Negaunee-Members of the North and South teams are expected to start reporting here tomorrow for the week's drill which will lead to the Upper Peninsula all-star football game here Aug. 13.

Saturday morning the players will report for physical examinations and will then be issued equipment.

Eddie Jankowski, coach of the South squad, will hold two practices Saturday and hopes to bring a South victory for the second straight year. His first drill is 10:30 Saturday morning and the other at 3:30 Saturday afternoon after a meeting with his team.

Russell Leksell, handling the North head coach assignments has not disclosed his schedule, but it probably will follow that of the South outfit.

Additions have been made to the squad because several of the original selection shave informed the committee that they will be unable to play.

The South squad has added Jim Erickson and Don Carlson, Escanaba backs. Warren Gustafson, Escanaba lineman, will not be able to participate in the game.

Kenneth Ziems, tackle, Calumet; Edward Kuivinen, center, Wakefield; James Hyppa, back, Wakefield, and Al Borsum, Newberry, back, will be unable to play and the committee has issued invitations to Jack Grigg, center, Ironwood; Donald Chopp, back, Calumet; Eugene Vitton, tackle, Wakefield; Robert Nelson, center, Munising, and George Brunette, back, L'Anse; as replacements for the North.

F.L. (Frosty) Ferzacca, Green Bay, Wis., has been named as head official. It will be familiar grounds for Ferzacca who served as South coach for two years.

He will be head coach for the North team in the Wisconsin high school all-star football game in Green Bay, Aug. 27.
