**Profits From All-Star Football Game Will Be Given to Charity; Seat Orders Indicate Huge Crowd**

Ishpeming-Three charities, the Holy Family orphanage, Marquette, the Good Will Farm, Houghton, and the Shriners' Hospital for Crippled Children, Minneapolis, will share equally in net proceeds of the all-star football game to be played under the lights of the Negaunee playgrounds at 8:30 Saturday night, August 17.

Oscar E. Wassberg, director of the attraction, announced the charity plan over the weekend in response to numerous queries concerning disposal of profits.

In the meantime, there is assurance that the game will attract one of the largest crowds ever recorded at an amateur sports event in the Upper Peninsula.

Wassberg reserved 65 tickets for each of the communities represented on the all-star squads, but many of the smaller towns have not required that many and surpluses are being sent wherever demand requires.

Menominee Range towns are showing warm enthusiasm toward the game. More than 500 requests have come from the sports-conscious communities along the Wisconsin border. Copper Country fans are ordering tickets and requests also have been received from the east. There has been a strong demand from Marquette County.

“There are still lots of good seats remaining,” Wassberg said this morning, “as the arrangements are such that any reserved seat will give the customer a good view of the game.”
