Mierzwa Named Assistant To Krueger On North Team

Negaunee-Francis "Red" Mierzwa, former Marquette University varsity football player, has been named assistant to Arthur Krueger, Marquette University freshman coach, who will direct the North team in the second annual Upper Peninsula All-Star football game to be played under the lights in Negaunee Saturday evening, August 16, at 8:30.

Mierzwa was a teammate of Krueger's at the Hilltopper school in 1930, '31 and '32, and since leaving college has been coaching in Wisconsin. His first job was as mentor of the Marquette University high school, Milwaukee, where his teams won four Catholic conference championships in eight years and never finished below third in the other four years.

Mierzwa's basketball teams won four conference titles and his track and field squads lost only eight meets of 60 in which they participated. For the last six years he has been line coach at Bay View High School, Milwaukee.

"The addition of Mierzwa to the North coaching staff gives assurance every boy on the squad will receive full attention during the week's drills preceding the big game," Oral J. (Moose) LaCombe, director of the game, said.
