### **Milwaukee Girl To Twirl Baton At Negaunee**

Negaunee-Members of the recreation committee met Tuesday night to complete plans for the U.P. all-star football game Aug. 14 and Edward Stevens, recreation director, said Miss Rosemary Schwebs, Menasha, Wis., national baton twirling champion, would not be able to appear as half time entertainer. Miss Sharon Goldin, Milwaukee, will replace her.

### **Chosen As Queen**

Miss Schwebs has been chosen "Miss Winnebagoland" and will compete for the title of "Miss Wisconsin" the night of August 14. She informed Stevens her opportunity to become "Miss Wisconsin" came after she accepted the engagement here, but because the state title also carries an award of a university scholarship, she could not appear here.

She also will defend her Wisconsin AAU diving championship Aug. 15 in Milwaukee.

She recommended Miss Goldin, who, she said, is an "artist" in baton twirling.

### **More Injuries**

More injuries to players picked for the "South" squad have perturbed the coach, F.L. "Frosty" Ferzacca.

He says he has lost outstanding players and has requested replacements from Menominee. The committee decided replacements would have to come from the list of alternates chosen by sports writers of that section.

A member of the committee said Menominee is represented by seven or eight players and “to pick more from that city would not be fair to other communities.”

### **Request Refused**

Ferzacca’s request for a particular Menominee player, who had not filed an application, was refused and an alternate from Escanaba was contacted.

Dick Erdman, Menominee, an original star on the South squad, was put back on the list on condition he sends the committee a letter signed by his physician and family, absolving the committee of liability in case of injuries. Erdman had an appendicitis operation a few weeks ago.

Wilbert H. Treloar, Marquette, was named as announcer for the game.

### **Drinking Banned**

The committee was emphatic in adopting a “no drinking” rule on the playgrounds the night of the game. Anyone caught drinking will be removed from the grounds.

U.P. sports writers attending the game will be guests of the committee at a pasty supper Saturday evening, August 14, in the recreation lodge of Jackson Park.

Members of the committee will welcome the players as they arrive tomorrow evening and they will be guests of the committee at a “get acquainted” meeting and the showing of “Diamond Dust,” a new technicolor film.
