All-Star Grid Teams Arrive in Negaunee

Negaunee—Approximately 45 players, representing the cream of last year's Upper Peninsula high school football teams have arrived here and are prepared to begin practices for the second annual U.P. all-star football game to be played a week from today, at 8:30 p.m., under the lights at the Negaunee Playgrounds.

All players will be housed at the Breiting Hotel, as will the North coaches, Arthur L. Krueger and Francis "Red" Mierzwa, former Marquette University football star, and south coaches, Faust "Frosty" Ferzacca and Pat Malone, Green Bay West high school mentors.

With the eyes of the Peninsula focused on Negaunee, the biggest problem facing the coaches at the first session was replacements needed for five players. Larry Kirkish, 229-pound tackle from Houghton, and Robert Gaulbault, 170-pound center from Ontonagon, will be unable to play on the North squad.

South replacements will be needed for Mike Doyle, 170-pound back from Menominee; Paul Larson, 180-pound Crystal Falls end, and William Lemke, 174-pound Menominee guard.

Tickets Going Fast

Tickets for the game were going "very fast", Oral J. "Moose" LaCombe, director, said today.

"All of the stadium tickets have been sold," LaCombe said, "but a few reserved bleacher seats remain. We are waiting until Tuesday to see what we have left of tickets sent to other places in the U.P."

General admission tickets will go on sale Monday, "in limited numbers", at the Viga Bowling Alley's, Miller's Newsstand and the Beau Chateau, Negaunee. The pre-game sale of general admissions is expected to eliminate much of the game rush for tickets.

The players will eat at a training table in St. Paul's school. All meals will be prepared by the Altar Society of St. Paul's.

There will be two drills for both squads each day until the game. They will alternate in using the Playgrounds and Legion field. One squad will use the field at night next Tuesday and the other on Thursday, to get practice under the lights.

The North drubbed its opponents, 21-7, in the All-Star game last year.
