North Team Drills Final Time Under Arcs Tonight

Negaunee, Aug. 11—The North all-star team will go through its final drill tonight under the playground lights in preparation for tomorrow night's fifth annual Upper Peninsula all-star game.

Coach Vic Wojciovski had the South team under the playground light last night its last major practice before the game Saturday night.

The game committee foresees a capacity crowd if the fair weather of the week continues through Saturday night. Ticket sales are good throughout Marquette County and reports from other Upper Peninsula cities are the same.

Pre-Game Ceremonies

The pre-game ceremonies will begin at 8:30 p.m. and fans are urged to be in their seats at that time.

Ray Ulbrich, manager of WDMJ, The Mining Journal radio station and popular sports announcer, will be the master of ceremonies for the evening.

Ulbrich appeared on the Columbia Broadcasting System Wednesday night as a guest "disc jockey" in the program the "ABC's of Music."

He is scheduled to arrive at the county airport Saturday afternoon and assured the committee before he left he would be on hand for the game unless bad weather forced the plane down between here and New York.

The members of both teams and their coaches will be introduced during the pre-game ceremonies.

Gene Short, Marquette, will be presented a watch in token of his selection by the game committee as an individual making outstanding contributions to sports. He is employed by The Mining Journal.

Half Time Entertainment

Two special acts have been secured for the entertainment of fans during the game's half time.

The first act will be the appearance of the trio of famous clowns, Dick Lewis, Brownie and Company. They will present a number of humorous acts.

The other act will feature Mrs. D.M. Rowlands of Miami, Fla., in a baton-twirling act which has brought acclaim from coast to coast.

Negaunee residents are urged to leave their cars at home and walk to the playgrounds Saturday night. The committee pointed out this would relieve the parking and traffic problems in the area.

The committee also seeks local residents to purchase tickets during the day to relieve congestion prior to the game. The playground box office will be open all day Saturday, beginning at 10 a.m. A number of reserved bleacher seats will be available. General admission, or standing room tickets, will be sold Saturday night, beginning at 6.
