## **South Stars Weak In Backfield, Strong On Line, Says Ferzacca**

Negaunee-Faust (Frosty) Ferzacca, coach of the South squad for the Upper Peninsula all-star football game to be played under the lights on the Negaunee Playgrounds Saturday night said today the South team shapes up as having a "good line, but a light and slow backfield."

"We already have made seven shifts in our original squad," Ferzacca said, "and we haven't exactly come out on top."

"We need backs very badly. Those we have are light and not as fast as I had hoped. We got off to a slow start because some of the boys were late in arriving, so our first practices didn't net us too much."

### **Use T-Formation**

Despite his assertion that the squad lacks capable backs, Ferzacca reiterated he would use the T-formation, which he learned from his friend, Ralph R. Jones, originator of the T. In the T, a heavy line and fast shifty backs are necessary.

Mike Doyle, 170-pound Menominee back, will be especially missed. Doyle, who is in Milwaukee preparing to enter Marquette University, had been counted on heavily for the South squad.

The boys are drilling twice daily under Ferzacca and his assistant, Pat Malone, former Stambaugh mentor now at Green Bay West. Friday night the team will drill under lights.

Besides Doyle, others who were dropped from the South squad are Paul Larsen, Crystal Falls end; William Lemke, Menominee guard; Edwin Smalley, Kingsford back; and Roy Peterson, Escanaba back.

### **Two Boys Injured**

Two players incurred slight injuries, which may keep them on the sidelines. Paul Homes, Kingsford center, hurt his knee while blocking on a pass defense drill, and Peter Danielson, Norway back, hurt his knee in a similar practice session.

Additions to the squad are Carl Johnson, 165-pound Gladstone end; Jack Peterson, 145-pound Escanaba back; Victor Albiero, 140-pound Crystal Falls back; Bill Cousineau, 150-pound Kingsford back, and Bill Smith, 135-pound Escanaba back.
