Menominee's Backs Start for South "11"

Negaunee-Menominee and Escanaba will dominate the South football team if the coaches stay by the South's probable starting lineup they released this noon for the Upper Peninsula all-star game which starts at 8:30 tonight on the playgrounds gridiron.

Coaches Eddie Jankowski and Marshall Reiboldt said three Menominee players would make up their starting backfield with another Menominee player in the line. Escanaba will have four players, Iron Mountain one or possibly two and Iron River one.
