3,000 Tickets For U.P. Football Classic Go On Sale In Negaunee

Negaunee-Three thousand general admission tickets for the U.P. all-star football game, which starts tonight on the Negaunee athletic field at 8:30, will go on sale at 6:30, when gates of the field will be opened. Tickets may be procured at either of the gates.

Reserved seat tickets not sold up to 6:30 will be placed on sale at the main gate. Reserved seat tickets ordered and not called for by 7 p.m. will be put on sale at the main gate. Persons who have ordered reserved seat tickets and have not taken them may get them at the main gate at any time after the V-J parade this afternoon.

No one will be admitted to the game without a ticket and ticket-holders are asked to keep their stubs throughout the game.

No Drinking Permitted

The committee again stressed the fact that intoxicating liquor will not be permitted inside the park.

Ticket sellers, ushers and others are asked to report at the main concession stand not later than 6:30 p.m. The concession stand will be operated by the Negaunee baseball team.

There will be special taxi and bus service to and from the game. Buses and taxis will unload and load for Marquette and Ishpeming at the gate in the south end of the field.

Teams Are Ready

Over 40 players, selected by U.P. sports writers, have been drilling since last Sunday for this annual classic and the coaches report the teams are in good condition.

Contrary to reports in other U.P. newspapers, neither coach has committed himself on a starting lineup. Members of both squads are in high spirits and the coaches realized that selection of tentative lineups might dampen that spirit.

“Frosty” Ferzacca and Pat Malone have been working hard for a “South” win, the first since the U.P. game series started. On the “North” side, Harry Conley and John McDonald have been working just as hard to make their debut as winning coaches and add to the no-defeat record of the “North.”

The “South” squad is heavier in the line but “North” has more “beef” in the backfield. The only sure prediction is “it will be a good game.”

Not All Football

The night will not be all football. Glamour will highlight between-half entertainment.

Miss Sharon Golden, Wisconsin state champion drum majorette, will be featured. The Escanaba girls’ drum corps also will appear and the Menominee band has notified the committee it will be on hand.

Seated in the guest section will be Mayor Dominic Olejniczak, of Green Bay, Wis., and coaches of several universities and colleges.

Three members of the University of Minnesota coaching staff arrived here yesterday, as did two from Stout Institute. Members of the University of Wisconsin and University of Michigan football coaching staffs also have reserved seats.
