## **Attendance At U.P. All-Star Football Game Will Exceed Expectations; Teams Drill**

Negaunee-One of the largest crowds ever to witness a football game in the Upper Peninsula is almost certain to be recorded, weather being favorable, at the all-star grid game here Saturday night.

With practically all reserved seats gone, there is still room for 5,000 general admission patrons and every one will have a clear view of the gridiron.

Oscar E. Wassberg, director of the game, has been unable to supply the demand for seats coming from all parts of the Peninsula, but he gave assurance today that all persons coming to the game will have a "spot" on the field from which they can see all the action.

### **Teams Drill Tonight**

The Peninsula's all-star football players, rapidly conditioning themselves for the stellar grid attraction here Saturday night, will get their first taste of night drills this evening.

The North squad, under the peppery management of Joe DeCook, will be under the lights about 8:45 while the South squad is being entertained by K. of C. club members.

Friday evening the South squad takes over for arc light drills, while North squad boys are guests of the Negaunee Elks. Similar programs have been planned for each of the crews, with a motor trip to points of interest and then return to the club for films and a lunch.

The teams have been drilling regularly twice a day, using the playgrounds and Legion fields.
